My stepping back will not be quite as dramatic and I intend to remain an active part of our church, just not as Lead Pastor.

But here's what we have done and will be doing together in June.

June 5 was Pentecost Sunday. In addition to the drama of the birthday of the church as recorded in Acts 2:1-12, we celebrated the Confirmation of our 2022 Confirmation Class. I began a message series titled CREDO, focusing on the Apostles Creed with the sermon "I Believe in God" with the biblical text of Psalm 19.

On June 12 we will recognize our recent graduates and present scholarships made possible by faithful giving over the years to our endowment. We will also be presenting Bibles to 3rd and 4th graders. The second sermon in the CREDO series will be "I Believe in Jesus Christ" with the biblical text Matthew 16:13-16. Later that day, we will once again offer Vacation Bible School for children in our church and community with our Mega Sports Camp VBS.

The third sermon in the CREDO series will be "I Believe in the Holy Spirit" from Ezekiel 37:1-10b and John 14:15-17

I'll wrap up the CREDO series on June 26 with the message "I Believe in the Church" from 1 Peter 2:9-10.

GOOD NEWS ON THE LOCAL MISSION FIELD

This morning (June 6) awesome God events were happening in our gymnasium with the beginning of the Newburgh United Women in Faith Summer Student Food Program. Today 36 families with a total of 98 children were blessed with food from our church. The invitations to participate in our program were sent to families of free/reduced lunch students at Newburgh, Sharon, Castle, and Yankeetown Elementary Schools as well as Castle North and South



Middle Schools. Parents were issued a weekly lunch ticket and asked how many children were in their family and which schools they attended. If families indicated they had preschoolers or high school students, these children were also included for food.

Our total start up food expenditures for Week 1 were \$3,280.92. Our start up expenditures in 2019 (pre-COVID) were \$2,985.72, a difference of \$295.20 more. I'm bringing this to your attention due to the upward costs of food and the need to procure continued/additional funding. I'm also in search of additional funding through local service organizations and grants. Therefore, if any of you can help with grant ideas or service clubs to contact, let me know.

Our Summer Student Food Program has a mushrooming effect upon our Food Pantry and Clothes Closet ministries. Today, both ministries reported new participants as a result of exposure and awareness from our program. The Food Pantry is always open to non-perishable food donations and personal care items to keep their shelves stocked. We have started up a list of some popular items to give ideas: June 5-11 your favorite snack

June 12-18 kid food; like Chef Boyardee products

June 19-25 cereal

June 26-July 2 peanut butter and jelly

*these are just suggestions from our Missions Team, any donations will be greatly appreciated!

BUT THERE'S A PRESSING NEED ON OUR LOCAL MISSION FIELD

Our church has provided assistance to people within our church family and beyond in Warrick County through our Assistance Fund for many years. With the end of the pandemic-related moratoriums on evictions, utility disconnections and supplemental public nutrition benefits, we have seen an increase in the number of people needing emergency assistance and the amount of their needs to the point that our designated Emergency Fund is now empty.

We have a system and process in place to be wise stewards of these funds and to do our best not to encourage dependency, but we can reasonably anticipate that these needs will continue and, in fact, increase. If you feel led, you may donate through the Sunday offering, online, or mail a check to the church office designating the Assistance Fund. A simple step that can make a huge difference!
